The Skills for Current and Future Jobs in The Bahamas program will develop local skills through apprenticeship and pre-apprenticeship programs targeted to Bahamians between the ages of 16-40 years old, increase the ability of job seekers to access quality local jobs and implement measurement tools to effectively assess the performance of the local labour market. The program features the Bahamas Apprenticeship Program with includes Pre-Apprenticeship and Apprenticeship Training.

		What is an apprenticeship?
		Apprenticeships are jobs which combine high quality training with the opportunity for technical education, so you become highly skilled in your chosen area of work.
		What is a pre-apprenticeship? Pre-Apprenticeships provide basic training to ensure that once the program is successfully completed, pre-apprentices are sufficiently qualified to apply to the Apprenticeship Program.

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		What can I expect as an apprentice?
		As an apprentice you would:
		 Follow the Bahamas Apprenticeship program to an approved standard Get time off the job for professional and technical study towards a qualification Join the national register of skilled people and get a national certificate when you successfully complete your program

		Receive workplace exposure that is not considered employment
		Be better positioned to apply for an apprenticeship

		Will I be paid during the apprenticeship?
		Apprenticeships involve employment and apprentices will earn a wage that is paid by the employer and subsidized by the Government. Applicants with and without work experience may be qualified to apply for the Apprenticeship Program. Employers will advertise their apprenticeship rates with each apprenticeship position and rates will vary based on the apprenticeship level.

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		Will I be paid during the pre-apprenticeship?
		Pre-Apprenticeships include classroom training and basic workplace exposure rather than employment. This program does not include a wage.
