## Data Notes and Explanation

## 1. Data Source

The source documents of the statistics in this report are the Customs import entries, declarations and export documents submitted by importers and exporters, which are subject to verification and approval by The Bahamas Customs Department.

## 2. Coverage

As recommended by the United Nations International 'Merchandise Trade Statistics Manual', and to the extent possible, the General Trade System is used for the recording and compilation of external trade statistics for The Bahamas. This system covers all types of inward and outward movement of goods through a country or territory, including movements through warehouses and free zones. In essence, it includes all merchandise that either add to or reduce the stock of material resources of a country or territory by entering (imports) or leaving (exports) the country's economic territory.

## 3. Transaction Values

The value of imports are c.i.f., that is, the value at the port of importation including freight and insurance charges and other charges incidental to the delivery at the port of import.

The values of exports are f.o.b., that is, the value of goods including the cost of transportation and insurance to the border of the exporting country.

The values presented are Bahamian dollars and the exchange rates prevailing at the time of importation are used in converting foreign currencies.

## 4. Changes/Exclusion to Presentation of Trade Data

Excluded from the compilation of the foreign trade statistics are the goods traded that do not make any changes to the wealth and material resources of the country. Examples of such goods are crude oil, residual fuel oils and certain chemicals temporarily imported for storage purposes only.

## 5. Commodity Classification

The classifications of goods used in this report are the Harmonized Description and Coding System, better known as the Harmonized System (HS) and the Standard International Trade Classification (SITC). The HS arranges goods according to their degree of manufacture and classifies them into ninety-seven chapters which are grouped into twenty-one sections. Section twenty-two was added to accommodate local trade. The SITC on the other hand, arranges goods according to their stage of production. The SITC contains sixty-seven divisions which are condensed into ten sections.

## Definitions and Abbreviations:

Imports - Goods imported from foreign countries for further processing or local consumption.

Domestic Exports - Goods produced or manufactured locally and exported to foreign countries.

Re-exports - goods exported in the same condition as when imported from a foreign country

Balance of Trade - is the total export minus the total import. It is usually calculated totally for a country or for each trading partner.

Port of Entry - a port that serves as a first port of entry from an international port.

## 4TH QUARTER 2023 TRADE DATA HIGHLIGHTS

## IMPORTS

Data on merchandise trade for 4th quarter 2023 shows that the value of commodities imported into The Bahamas totaled $\$ 1,045$ billion resulting in an decrease of $3 \%$ when compared with the same period last year.

The major groups of merchandise, were 'Machinery And Transport Equipment,' which totaled $\$ 219$ million, 'Food And Live Animals' at $\$ 189$ million and 'Miscellneous Manufactured Articles' which totaled $\$ 179$ million. The combined value of these categories represented $56 \%$ of total imports.

Other categories that contributed to total imports were 'Manufactured Goods Classified Chiefly By Materials' which accounted for $\$ 140$ million, 'Mineral Fuels, Lubricants And Related Materials' value at $\$ 134$ million and 'Chemicals', at $\$ 80$ million (these groups together represented 34\% of total Imports).

Categories that showed an increase when compared to the same quarter last year were 'Crude Minerals, Inedible Except Fuels', and 'Animal And Vegetable Oil And Fats' which increased by $17 \%$, and $13 \%$ respectively.

The groups that decreased in value when compared to the same period last year were 'Mineral Fuels, Lubricants And Related Materials, and 'Beverages And Tobacco' which declined by $30 \%$, and $7 \%$, respectively.

## EXPORTS

As it relates to total exports, for 4th quarter 2023, data shows that the value of commodities exported (Domestic and Re-Export) from The Bahamas totaled $\$ 143$ million resulting in an slight decrease of $8 \%$ when compared with the same period last year.

The categories that contributed the largest proportion to the exports were 'Mineral Fuels, Lubricants And Related Materials' which totaled $\$ 50$ million, 'Manufactured Goods Classified Chiefly By Materials' at \$26million, and 'Food And Live Animals' at \$24 million which combined represented $70 \%$ of total exports.

Categories that showed significant increases were 'Chemicals', and 'Machinery And Transport Equipment' and Manufactured Goods Classified Chiefly By Materials "' which increased by $259 \%, 103 \%$ and $29 \%$ respectively when compared to the same quarter last year.

The groups that decreased in value when compared to the same period last year were 'Miscellneous Manufactured Articles, and 'Crude Minerals, Inedible Except Fuels' which declined by $80 \%$, and $67 \%$, respectively.
