Additional Requirements

- * The Phytosanitary Certificate must not be issued more than seven (7) days prior to shipment.
- * Consignments not listed and/or exceeding quantities stated on the import application, invoice and phytosanitary certificate, will be confiscated and destroyed.
- * The Agricultural Inspector can demand a quarantine treatment or seize and destroy any consignment that is infected, diseased, infested or contaminated. Materials held for diagnostic assessment and technical advice/consultation would not be released from quarantine until all testing and screening procedures have been completed and found negative of quarantine pathogens.
- * Imported plants, plant products, and/or other regulated articles must be inspected by an Agricultural Inspector as well as a Bahamas Customs officer before being released.
- * The Plants, Plant Product and/or Other Regulated Articles must be accompanied by a Phytosanitary Certificate from the Country of Origin and issued by a Competent Authority stating treatment(s) given.
