**Feature of the Week:**

*GPD's Supplies Section*

On 27<sup>th</sup> March, 1997, Miss Yvonne Johnson from the Accounts Section of the Cabinet Office, along with Mr. Garnet Knowles and Mr. Jeffrey Knowles from the Ministry of Finance, held a meeting at Government Printing Department. The purpose was to discuss the creation of a Supplies Section and to identify an Officer to be trained as Manager of the same. Mr. Simeon Ambrose was chosen. On Monday, 26<sup>th</sup> May, 1997, Mr. Ambrose reported to the Materials Management Section of the Princess Margaret Hospital to begin an intense study in the operation of the Supplies Section. This study ended on Friday, 30<sup>th</sup> May, 1997.

On 16<sup>th</sup> February, 1998, Mr. Charles Forbes from the Royal Bahamas Defence Force was introduced as the Officer responsible for setting up a workable system through which accountability could be achieved via proper record keeping. Immediately, various Forms and Booklets were drafted based on the ideas given by Mr. Forbes to Mr. Ambrose.

Those documents were to assist this Section in carrying out its mandate to effect all transactions with the relevant Agencies (private and government,

local and foreign) as to goods and services. The ordering (supplies) and upkeep of all equipment and the building itself are the responsibility of the Supplies Section, which should report on all activities taking place.

There are various items earmarked for distribution within the Department that should be available upon request, to effect a smooth transition in its day-to-day operation. Those include paper stock, ink and various press aids for the Print Room, ink cartridges and other consumables for Pre-Press, binding tapes and glue, etc. for the Bindery, and cleaning products for the Janitorial Staff.

To date, this Section has transitioned from manual paperwork to computers. With a Staff of three, Mr. Ambrose, Mr. Lester Bill Fawkes and Mr. Dax

Deveaux can now complete their assignments in a quicker turnaround.

## Jalapeno Popper Stuffed Chicken



### INGREDIENTS:

- 1 8-oz pkg cream cheese, softened
- 1/2 cup shredded cheddar cheese
- 2 jalapeno peppers, seeded and minced
- 4 strips bacon, diced
- 4 6-oz boneless skinless chicken breasts
- 1 cup breadcrumbs
- 1/2 tsp salt
- 1/4 tsp pepper
- 1/4 tsp Onion Powder
- 1/4 tsp Garlic Powder
- 1/4 cup vegetable oil

### DIRECTIONS:

1. Cook the bacon in a skillet over medium heat until crispy. Drain on paper towels.
2. Stir together the cream cheese, cheddar cheese, bacon, and jalapenos in a small bowl.
3. Cut a pocket horizontally through the thickest side of each chicken breast, and fill with 1/4 of the cheese mixture. Secure with toothpicks.
4. Combine the breadcrumbs with the salt, pepper, onion powder, and garlic powder. Roll the chicken breasts in the breadcrumb mixture to coat.
5. Heat the oil in a skillet over medium to medium-high heat, and cook chicken breasts until no longer pink in the centre and the juices run clear, about 8 minutes per side. If your chicken breasts are thick, they can be finished in a 350-degree oven.
