## IMPORTANT NOTES

\*\*\*Effective 30<sup>th</sup> January, 2021, the Ministry of Health will report the newly imported confirmed cases of COVID-19 in The Bahamas as a result of travel.

Since 1<sup>st</sup> January, 2021, there have been sixteen (16) COVID-19 confirmed cases in New Providence and one (1) COVID-19 confirmed case in Exuma with a history of travel within fourteen (14) days


Today, 30<sup>th</sup> January, 2021, there are 5 newly COVID-19 confirmed cases in New Providence with a history of travel within fourteen (14) days.

This table will only appear when there are newly imported confirmed cases of COVID-19 in The Bahamas.

## REMINDERS


To contain the spread of COVID-19 residents are reminded of the following:

- if you have symptoms of COVID-19, do not wait, first contact your health provider.
- while home remedies may work for a period it is important to get tested and receive proper care before symptoms become too difficult to manage.
- if you have been asked by the Surveillance Unit to get tested for COVID-19, please follow the advice and take the gold standard RT-PCR test.
- employees are encouraged to work from home.
