✓ Twenty-four percent (24%) of the Labour Force was made up of persons between the ages

of 25 - 34 years.

- ✓ Sixty-four percent (64%) of the Employed Labour Force was engaged by the private sector.
- ✓ Approximately eleven percent (11%) of the Employed Labour Force was Non-Bahamian.
- ✓ The "Community, Social and Personal Service" industry, which includes the civil service, police service and domestic service continued to be the country's largest employer in 2017 and accounted for 36% of the workforce.
- ✓ During the period 2012 to 2017, the share of workers in vulnerable employment was fairly stable and ranged from 7.0% to 9.2% of the employed labour force. In May 2017 the percentage of men in this category was higher, although the percentage points differences between men and women were fairly small. Vulnerable employment was 8.2% of total employment. These workers as defined by ILO are less likely to have formal work arrangements, and more likely to lack decent working conditions and are often characterized by inadequate earnings and benefits.

- Twenty-eight percent (28%) of unemployed persons were between the ages of 25-35
- ✓ The number of private households in The Bahamas was estimated to be 111,740 however, only 101,190 of these households provided information and of this number 59% were headed by men.
- ✓ The Average Household Income was B\$39,048.

OUTLINE OF THE LABOUR FORCE SURVEY

PURPOSE

The primary objective of the Labour Force Survey (LFS) of The Bahamas is to provide up-to-date information on the Labour Force size and characteristics on an annual basis.

2. PROCESSES OF THE 2017 SURVEY

2.1 SAMPLE DESIGN

In general the LFS sample is drawn from New Providence, Grand Bahama and most recently Abaco and two or three additional Family Islands. The Family Islands covered in each cycle of the LFS are rotated in and out of sample to ensure that over time the more populated islands are represented directly. In May 2017, Bimini, Exuma, remained in the sample and will be rotated out in the November 2017 round. Crooked Island and Mayaguana was surveyed for the first time.

The Department utilizes a multi-stage-stratified design in which each selected island forms a stratum. Each stratum contains a number of supervisory districts, which correspond to the political constituencies, as they existed in 2010. All supervisory districts are represented in the sample. The supervisory districts are further subdivided into enumeration districts. The number of enumeration districts depends on the number of households in the supervisory district as each enumeration area comprises about 150 households. In turn, enumeration districts (ED's) are selected at random based on the size of the supervisory district relative to the stratum. Finally, households within the selected ED's are selected randomly.

The May 2017 sample included 2,500 private households in New Providence, Grand Bahama, Abaco, Exuma, Bimini, Crooked Island and Mayaguana. All persons 15 years of age and over within these households who were usual residents were interviewed.

2.2 FIELD OPERATIONS

In practice, the survey includes two phases of fieldwork. In the first phase all the households in the selected enumeration districts are listed. This procedure takes approximately four (4) months. The second phase, which usually occurs in May, consists of enumerating randomly selected households from the lists of households of the enumeration districts. Administrative field checks usually last for four weeks after the enumeration.

2.3 METHOD OF DATA COLLECTION

Data for the labour force are collected by personal interview, usually with the head or other responsible member of the household. Every year approximately ninety-five enumerators and twenty supervisors are recruited to complete the task.

2.4 ESTIMATION PROCEDURES

Information from individuals and households with like characteristics are weighted-up to produce separate population estimates by sex based on the population ratio estimation method. In the estimating procedure the estimates of the total Non-Institutional Population 15 years old and over is used to blow up the sample estimates. Separate raising factors are calculated for males and females using the formula:

Where Pi is the estimated total population 15 years and over and pi is the sample population 15 years and over.

3. RELIABILITY OF DATA

The estimates in this report are based on information collected in the May 2017 sample survey carried out in New Providence, Grand Bahama, Abaco, Bimini, Exuma, Crooked Island, and Mayaguana. These estimates are prone to sampling errors and therefore are subjected to statistical tests, which help in ascertaining the reliability of the data.


The absolute value of the standard error and its value in relation to the magnitude of the statistics (proportion in this instance) being estimated should be cited. For this purpose, the standard error can be expressed as a proportion (percent) of the value being estimated. This is called the relative error or coefficient of variation. Therefore, when using data, comparisons of the larger estimates may be used with confidence but smaller estimates should be regarded with caution. For instance, small differences from one period to another may be due only to sampling error. For this reason, comparison of particular variables from one survey to another should be used cautiously and should be regarded only as a guideline for ascertaining general trends.


This is an inevitable limitation of data obtained by sampling, and consequently, restricts the detailed cross-classifications that can be attempted. Detailed cross-classification or detailed information for very small areas can be best obtained from a Census.



APPENDIX I – HISTORICAL BACKGROUD

HISTORICAL BACKGROUND

In 1973, the Department of Statistics (DOS) introduced the first Household Survey. It was designed to collect data on the Labour Force as well as Household Income. The survey was conducted biennially until 1979, after which there was a break in the series. The survey was revived in 1986 and since 1988 has been conducted annually in census years.

In 1991, a Rotational Sample Survey was introduced and since the 2000 Census a new design was implemented. The early survey covered New Providence, Grand Bahama and six of the Family Islands. This coverage proved costly and was also difficult to manage. Results, from the latest Census indicated that New Providence and Grand Bahamas accounted for approximately 85% of both population and dwellings in The Bahamas. Therefore, the new sample design has New Providence and Grand Bahama sampled annually with the remaining island sampled on a rotation basis.

APPENDIX II - CONCEPTS AND DEFINITIONS

CONCEPTS AND DEFINITIONS

REFERENCE WEEK

In 2017, the enumeration began on May 1ST and continued until the end of May. The week proceeding this period, April 25 to April 30th, was the reference week. All data collected referred to economic activity during that seven-day period.

PRIVATE HOUSEHOLD

A private household is defined as a person or group of persons who live together and who collectively make provision for sustenance, budgeting and other essentials for living. Any one of the following may constitute a household:

- i) a family with or without lodgers or servants.
- ii) a person living alone.
- iii) a group of unrelated persons living together.

HEAD OF HOUSEHOLD

The head of the household is that person who is acknowledged as such by the other members. This is usually but not necessarily, the person who bears the chief responsibility for the economic maintenance of the household.

HOUSEHOLD INCOME

This is the total annual receipts of personal incomes of all persons in the household and includes payments for production, such as wages and salaries, income from self-employment and earned rent, dividends and interest receipts.

<u>AGE</u>

Age refers to age at last birthday in years

MARITAL STATUS

This refers to the personal status of each individual in relation to the marriage laws, or customs of The Bahamas. Marital status categories are as follows:

- i) single(never married)
- ii) married(legally)
- iii) common-law
- iv) other

THE LABOUR FORCE/ ECONOMICALLY ACTIVE POPULATION

The labour force is that segment of the population, fifteen years of age and over, engaged in or willing and able to be engaged in the production of goods and services. It is composed of those persons with jobs- the Employed, and those without jobs but who were engaged in some jobseeking activity- the Unemployed.

THE EMPLOYED POPULATION

This includes:

- i) all persons 15 years of age and over who worked for pay any time during the reference week or who worked without pay for at least one hour in a family-operated enterprise.
- ii) Persons who were temporarily absent from their regular jobs because of vacation, illness, inclement weather, or similar reasons.

THE UNEMPLOYED POPULATION

The unemployed population incorporates persons 15 years of age and over who did not work or have a job from which they were temporarily absent during the reference week, but were actively looking for work in the four weeks prior to the survey week and were able and willing to work. Persons who did not look for work because they were on layoff or waiting to start a new job within the following 30 days were also counted among the unemployed.

THE UNEMPLOYMENT RATE

Represents the number of persons unemployed as a percentage of the labour force.

THE LABOUR FORCE PARTICIPATION RATE

The percentage of the population 15 years of age and over that is in the labour force (people who work or are looking for work).

EMPLOYMENT STATUS

Classifies persons as follows:

- i) Government Employees- individuals who work for a government department or corporation.
- ii) Private Employees- individuals who work for a private business.
- iii) Self-Employed Persons persons who operate their own business, with or without paid help.
- iv) Unpaid Family Workers- persons who work in family enterprises, without pay, for at least one hour during the reference week.

OCCUPATION

This refers to the type of work actually performed by individuals. Classification is according to the International Standard Classification of Occupations (ISCO).

INDUSTRY

The industry in which individuals are classified relates to the main type of economic activity carried on by the firms or business in which they are employed. Classification is based on the International Standard Industrial Classification of all Economic Activities (ISIC).

PART-TIME WORKERS

For the purposes of the survey, part-time workers were determined subjectively (an individual's own assessment). To obtain this information employed persons were asked, "Do you work full-time or part-time?

DISCOURAGED WORKERS

These are persons who may or may not have worked before, are able and willing to work, but are not actively seeking work because they believe they would not find work. Because they were not seeking work during the four weeks preceding the date of enumeration they were not counted among the unemployed and are therefore, not a part of the labour force
