***<u>IMPORTANT NOTES</u>

The Ministry of Health reports today that there were two hundred and twenty-eight (228) cases. This number is a historical one as it is the highest number ever reported in The Bahamas in one day. The numbers seen today demonstrate that the virus that causes COVID-19 is ever-present and continues to be transmitted in the country. It should be noted that a total of 499 cases were reported between the 1st - 5th August, 2021. For the same time last week, $25^{th} - 29^{th}$ July, 2021, 558 confirmed cases were reported.

On 2nd August 2021, The Bahamas celebrated Emancipation Day as a public holiday. It is noteworthy to mention that when we experience a holiday, members of the public may delay getting tested for COVID-19. Most laboratory facilities would be closed. The Ministry has observed that this often results in an uptick in the number of confirmed cases reported days following a holiday. The Ministry continues its monitoring to ensure timely responses to this evolving pandemic.

We will get through this together if we remember to:

- 1. keep private social gatherings restricted to 5 or fewer persons, provided they are vaccinated;
- 2. stay home if you don't feel well;
- 3. wear a mask outside of your home;
- 4. regularly wash your hands;
- 5. remain socially distant; and
- 6. avoid large gatherings at restaurants, workplaces, churches, celebrations and family reunions.

The Ministry of Health encourages all to remain disciplined, continue to apply the COVID-19 health precautions and to get vaccinated at the first opportunity. Appointments are available at vax.gov.bs.
